



Population - Sunshine Coast, 1956 - 2006





Population Growth - Sunshine Coast and B.C., 1961 - 2006





Population and Population Growth - Sunshine Coast, 1976 - 2010




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Migration Components, Sunshine Coast, Annually





Age Distribution of Total Net Migration - Sunshine Coast





Age Distribution of Net International Migration - Sunshine Coast






Age Distribution of Net Intraprovincial Migration - Sunshine Coast


Population Age Distribution - Sunshine Coast and B.C., 2010


Population and demographic summary:

- High population growth in 70s and last half of of 80s and first half of 90s; lower in last decade
- Population growth driven mainly by migration; largest migration segment from lower mainland
- More than 2/3rds of net migration is in age group 45 years or older mainly from lower mainland
- Net migration outflow in the 15-24 and 75+ age groups
- Net international migration is more concentrated in the under age 45 groups;

Population and demographic summary:


- Sunshine Coast population has higher proportion in 45+ age groups and lower proportion in under 44 age groups than B.C.
- Population aged 55+ increased more than 140% since 1986 compared to less than 45% in the under 55 age groups
- Aging of the post-war baby boom and the older age make-up of migration to the Sunshine Coast are main factors

Employment Growth - Sunshine Coast, Lower Mainland-Southwest and B.C., 1986 - 2006




Unemployment Rates - Sunshine Coast, Lower Mainland-Southwest and B.C., 1986 - 2006

Per cent of labour force



Industry Composition of Labour Force - Sunshine Coast, 1986 - 2006








Annual Timber Harvest - Sunshine Coast Forest District


Business Incorporations - Sunshine Coast, 1990 - 2010

Number of incorporations





Business Locations by Employment Size - Sunshine Coast, 2010





Employed by Place of Residence and Place of Work - Sunshine Coast, 1996 - 2006





Industry Concentration 2001 and 2006 - Sunshine Coast





Industry Concentration 2001 and 2006 - Sunshine Coast






Factors of Employment Growth - Sunshine Coast, 2001 - 2006

Industry Concentration and Local Growth 2001 and 2006 - Sunshine Coast


Local growth conditions (regional shift # of jobs) GOODS Industries

Industry Concentration and Local Growth 2001 and 2006 - Sunshine Coast


Local growth conditions (regional shift # of jobs) SERVICE Industries


Economic dependency changes from 1991 to 2006 - Sunshine Coast

Per cent of income





E.I. Beneficiaries - Sunshine Coast, Jan. 2004 - Jul. 2011





Economic summary:

- Economy less dependent on natural resources, more service industry-oriented economic base
- Businesses are smaller sized, reflecting a smaller market
- Long-term decline in primary industry jobs; mainly forestry, fishing;
 Port Mellon mill largest employer
- A significant number of workers commute or have no fixed workplace address
- Some concentration in primary resources, mining, construction
- Services industry concentration limited to retail trade and arts, entertainment, and recreation

Economic summary:


- Economy largely dependent on external factors for growth with some lift from local growth conditions
- Construction and real estate at cyclical high in 2006; accounts for much of measured regional shift or local growth advantage
- Large local growth advantage in retail trade
- Local growth conditions positive for IC (information and cultural),
 ASW (administrative/support/waste management), and PST (professional/technical/scientific) industries
- Accommodation-food services a growth laggard measurement issues or underlying shortcomings?

Economic summary:

- Relatively high dependence on non-employment income (pensions, dividends/interest, annuities, etc.) and transfer payments (CPP, OAS, GIS, EI, etc.)
- Higher growth phases associated with higher in-migration, expansion in real estate activity, and more construction to meet higher residential and non-residential space demands
- Local economy currently in low-growth phase


Residential Sales - Sunshine Coast, 1976 - 2010

Number of sales





Residential Median Sales Price - Sunshine Coast, 1976 - 2010





Residential Building Permits - Sunshine Coast, 1998 - 2010




External Ownership of Residential - Sunshine Coast, 2001 - 2010




External Ownership of Residential by Origin - Sunshine Coast, 2010









MLS Residential Sales - Sunshine Coast, Jan. 2004 - Sept. 2011





MLS Residential Sales-to-active Listings Ratio - Sunshine Coast, Jan. 2004 - Sept. 2011



MLS Benchmark House Price - Sunshine Coast, Jan. 2004 - Sept. 2011



Residential summary:


- Housing sales and construction activity highly cyclical
- Large non-local ownership of residential properties; generates large seasonal increase in population
- Majority of non-local owners from lower mainland
- Non-local ownership highest (80%) in SCRD
- Within incorporated areas, non-local ownership highest in District of Sechelt
- Curent housing market conditions sales sliding lower, large number of listings on the market, price weakness, low construction volume

Labour Force and Employment - Sunshine Coast, 1986 - 2006





5-Year Change in Labour Force and Employment - Sunshine Coast, 1986 - 2006





Forecast summary:

- Higher growth largely depends on stronger economy and housing markets in Metro Vancouver and B.C. leading to more in-migration and non-local ownership activity
- U.S. economy in sub-par growth phase for another two or more years; intensfying sovereign debt problems in Europe
- External growth outlook improves in medium and longer term but business cycle timing uncertain
- Economy improves in second half of ten-year forecast;
- Local economy faces weak to modest growth in 2011 and 2012; improves later in forecast period
- Higher in-migration and population growth drives real estate, construction, and retail employment

Forecast summary:

- Non-local residential ownership continues to increase
- Age strucuture of population shifts towards older age groups
- By 2021, more than one-half of resident population aged over 55 and one-third aged 65 years or older

Economic development considerations:

- Develop unified vision and economic development strategy that builds on strengths and identifies obstacles
- Enhance opportunities to retain, expand, and attract businesses and people
- Support/develop exports of local goods and services; encourage import substitution and 'buy local'
- Promote and market Sunshine Coast
